The Sacraments – Our Life in Christ

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation. Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Eucharist. We follow the command of the Lord to baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). Chrismation (Confirmation) and Holy Eucharist (First Holy Communion) are imparted at the same time immediately following baptism.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Infants – is scheduled at the Divine Liturgy on Saturdays or Sundays during the year except certain fast periods. Sponsors must be Catholics in good standing and supply a sponsor card attesting to that from their parish. While two Catholics in good standing is usual, one baptized non-Catholic can function as a Christian Witness with the Catholic sponsor. Both must be at least sixteen years of age. Details are available at the parish office.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Adults – follows a period of catechumenate. This is a period of spiritual formation. Please see the priest or deacon.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Crowning in Marriage – According to the Pastoral Policy and Guidelines for Marriage Preparation for the Catholic

Church in New Jersey, couples wishing to marry must inform the pastor one year before the date of the wedding and be free to marry in the Catholic Church. They will meet with the priest and deacon in four sessions—to begin the Pre-Nuptial Questionnaire, to take FOCCUS, a communication, values, and religious inventory approved for use in the Catholic dioceses/eparchies, to complete the Pre-Nuptial Questionnaire, and for a session on the Theology of the Mystery (Sacrament). They are also required to attend Pre-Cana Conference.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance – The Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance is regularly available each Saturday 11:30 AM to 12:00 Noon. In addition, confessions are heard during the Christmas Fast (Advent) and the Great Fast (Lent) at other scheduled times. Visiting confessors are also scheduled at special times during the Great Fast. Confessions are also heard on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Great and Holy Week. Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life-endangering medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of confession at church or home where there is more privacy.

Anointing of the Sick – Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life-threatening medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of the Sacrament of Penance and Anointing of the Sick. If surgery is scheduled, please consider confession and anointing at the church or at your home rather than the hospital since there is more privacy for confession and less chance for interruption. If you are unable to come to church or are at the hospital, family members should contact the rectory so Father can anoint at the hospital.

Holy Communion and Visitation of the Sick – Holy Communion is brought to our parishioners who are ill at the hospital or at home by the deacons on Sundays and at other time by arrangement. Please contact the deacons or the rectory office by Friday prior to the Sunday communion visitation.

Funeral Services – The Office of Christian Burial is offered in ways to accommodate the needs of the family. The Epiphany Ladies Guild as part of their charity offers a Mercy Meal for families at the Parish Center following the interment. Epiphany of our Lord cemetery are two portions of Fairfax Memorial Park. Parishioners who are interested in purchasing cemetery plots should see the deacon.

PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS

EMC Meeting. The next meeting of the EMC is **Sunday February 2, 2025.** The meeting will begin in the back of the Hall **immediately following** the conclusion of the 9 am Liturgy. Food and beverages will be provided.

Lenten Dinners. Epiphany will be serving savory, meatless, Eastern European meals Fridays during Lent from 4:00 PM – 7:00 PM, for carry-out and limited dining-in sponsored by Epiphany Ladies Guild. Pirohi (potato and cheese filled dumplings), halushki (sauteed noodles with cabbage), vegetarian soups, and homemade desserts. Meal items priced separately. **Pre-Sanctified Liturgy will be celebrated at 7:30 PM.** The first Lenten Dinner will be served March 7 and continues every Friday through April 11. There is no Lenten Dinner Good Friday.

Slavic-American Festival Wrap-up Meeting. The wrap-up meeting for the 2024 Slavic-American Festival is scheduled Wednesday, January 29, 2025, at 7:30 PM in the parish center. Chairs of events are encouraged to attend this very interesting meeting. Anyone interested in the outcomes of the festival are welcome to attend.

Church Mortgage. The fourth quarter 2024 interest payment of \$4,584.62 on the loan for the new church has been paid to the Eparchy of Passaic. The balance of the loan remains \$611,282.67. For 2025, the first three quarter interest payments will be \$4,584.62 each quarter. The principal payment of \$75,000 is due in September which will lower the balance in 2025 to \$536,282.67. The fourth quarter 2025 interest payment will be only \$4,022. Looking to the future, the principal payments will reduce the debt in 2026 to \$4,282.67 and in 2027 to \$386,282.67. There is a balloon payment at the end which will fully amortize the debt service.

Flea Market. Due to burst frozen pipes in the parish center kitchen, the Flea Market had to be postponed from this weekend to next weekend, Saturday, February 2nd in the parish center. Seventy-seven tables are registered. It promises to be a fun day of exploring new finds.

EMC Super Bowl Bash. The Epiphany Men's Club Super Bowl Bash will be held once again on Super Bowl Sunday, February 9, 2025. All are welcome. In accord with NFL regulations, there is no charge to attend the Super Bowl Bash. More details will follow.

EPARCHIAL AND OTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS

Bishop's Appeal. The Bishop's Appeal has begun. Each parishioner family should have received a mailing from the Eparchy of Passaic. The goal for Epiphany of our Lord remains the same, \$19,800. The parishioners have pledged \$18,475 to date to the Bishop's Appeal. God bless you for your generosity to the eparchy and so that our eparchy can offer financial help to the Eparchy of Mukachevo as they labor to care for refugees from other oblast's in Ukraine.

Fairfax Memorial Park. Several years ago, members of Epiphany Byzantine Church purchased grave sites, in either direction from Fairfax Memorial Park or indirectly through the church. The cemetery also gave the church an option for future sites which were put on hold for purchase at a later date. The plan was to have a dedicated portion of the cemetery for Byzantine Catholics to be laid to rest.

Epiphany congregants have since been laid to rest in some of those sites, and there are still approximately 20-30 still on hold. These sites officially were put on hold for the church several years ago, but it has come to the attention of the cemetery that this particular section has been almost sold out and very few were purchased through our church. As a result, and because demand from families of other churches, these sites will very soon be taken out of the “hold” status and offered to the general public.

The cemetery has been more than fair in holding these sites for our congregation. We are now at a point where we should ask our members if they have any immediate interest in any of these sites.

It is a beautiful location surrounded by trees, shrubs and flowers as well as mausoleums and columbarium buildings. Fairfax Memorial is offering our members a promotion put in place until January 31st. Each site purchased will receive a 10% discount up to a maximum of 25% for the purchase of (4) sites, suitable for a small family.

They will also give up to (5) years’ financing with a nominal amount of down payment. Remember that grave sites will double in price every (10) years. If this is something you have immediate interest in pursuing, you may contact:
