The Sacraments – Our Life in Christ

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation. Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Eucharist. We follow the command of the Lord to baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). Chrismation (Confirmation) and Holy Eucharist (First Holy Communion) are imparted at the same time immediately following baptism.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Infants – is scheduled at the Divine Liturgy on Saturdays or Sundays during the year except certain fast periods. Sponsors must be Catholics in good standing and supply a sponsor card attesting to that from their parish. While two Catholics in good standing is usual, one baptized non-Catholic can function as a Christian Witness with the Catholic sponsor. Both must be at least sixteen years of age. Details are available at the parish office.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Adults – follows a period of catechumenate. This is a period of spiritual formation. Please see the priest or deacon.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Crowning in Marriage – According to the Pastoral Policy and Guidelines for Marriage Preparation for the Catholic Church in New Jersey, couples wishing to marry must inform the pastor one year before the date of the wedding and be free to marry in the Catholic Church. They will meet with the priest and deacon in four sessions—to begin the Pre-Nuptial Questionnaire, to take FOCCUS, a communication, values, and religious inventory approved for use in the Catholic dioceses/eparchies, to complete the Pre-Nuptial Questionnaire, and for a session on the Theology of the Mystery (Sacrament). They are also required to attend Pre-Cana Conference.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance – The Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance is regularly available each Saturday 11:30 AM to 12:00 Noon. In addition, confessions are heard during the Christmas Fast (Advent) and the Great Fast (Lent) at other scheduled times. Visiting confessors are also scheduled at special times during the Great Fast. Confessions are also heard on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Great and Holy Week. Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life-endangering medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of confession at church or home where there is more privacy.

Anointing of the Sick – Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life-threatening medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of the Sacrament of Penance and Anointing of the Sick. If surgery is scheduled, please consider confession and anointing at the church or at your home rather than the hospital since there is more privacy for confession and less chance for interruption. If you are unable to come to church or are at the hospital, family members should contact the rectory so Father can anoint at the hospital.

Holy Communion and Visitation of the Sick – Holy Communion is brought to our parishioners who are ill at the hospital or at home by the deacons on Sundays and at other time by arrangement. Please contact the deacons or the rectory office by Friday prior to the Sunday communion visitation.

Funeral Services – The Office of Christian Burial is offered in ways to accommodate the needs of the family. The Epiphany Ladies Guild as part of their charity offers a Mercy Meal for families at the Parish Center following the interment. Epiphany of our Lord cemetery are two portions of Fairfax Memorial Park. Parishioners who are interested in purchasing cemetery plots should see Deacon Peter Turko.

The particular Law of the Byzantine Ruthenian Metropolitan Church directs that “the pastor is to celebrate the Divine Liturgy for the people of the parish entrusted to him on Sundays and days of precept (holydays of obligation) (canon 294). This liturgy intention for parishioners is “For the Intention of Parishioners.” The faithful who attend the Divine Liturgy for the parishioners participate, according to their state, in praying for that intention. 1700th Anniversary. Bishop Kurt wishes to inform the Faithful of the Eparchy that Tuesday, May 20th, the 1700th anniversary of the First Ecumenical Council at Nicea was observed. The Byzantine Churches observe the memory of the First Council annually on the Sunday after Ascension Thursday. Bishop Kurt points out that this Council established the calculations for the date of Pascha each year, legislated that kneeling was not permitted on the fifty days of Pascha and on Sundays, and issued the Nicene Creed (not the Creed the Church uses now. The Churches use the Symbol of Faith of the Second Ecumenical Council of 381, referred as the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed).

Paschal Rituals. We do not kneel from Easter Sunday to Pentecost for any of the liturgical services, for the time of penance is completed, and joy now reigns. Pentecost Sunday kneeling will resume.

Fifth All Souls Saturday. The fifth All Souls Saturday is this Saturday, June 7th. The Divine Liturgy of Remembrance for the Departed will be celebrated at 10:00 AM. The Diptychs will be read.

Radio Use Information Session. Motorola representative, Paula Weaver, met with Jamie last Monday. The meeting was very productive. Only 5 channels were programmed on the radios before they were shipped. Having the radio set on a channel above 5 would not work. The radios are NOT to be holstered in the charger. If they are not being used, they do not need to be charged frequently. If they stay in the charger, it kills the battery. The radio remains in off position unless you are using it. Candy and church people, especially, let the office know you are working so that the office radio is on too so we can hear you if you need to contact us. When you arrive in the building, turn on your radio. All the radios must be on the same channel in order to communicate with each other. Our radios are set on channel 3. There are two radios in each of the four buildings. A. Church – 1. Ushers' room on the window ledge; 2. LL in

the space occupied by the construction documents sitting on a little table on the right-hand wall. B. Chapel- 1. Sacristy-next to the sound system equipment. 2. Basement Kitchen – Passthrough counter. C. Parish Center – Upstairs Kitchen – shelf above cake cutting counter opposite walk-in freezer & back door. 2. LL Storage room on table next to interior wall about half the length of the room. D. Parish Office/Rectory – Both are in Jamie’s Office because that is the only place that had enough outlets available. And where the counters are on Sundays should they need help. One of the two is a roaming radio to be used for the festival, for Fr. John in the rectory, or for anytime we need an extra radio not assigned. Each radio is labeled and assigned, so it is important to get it back to its proper home after use. Please direct any questions to Jamie at the Parish Office.
