The Sacraments – Our Life in Christ

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation. Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Eucharist. We follow the command of the Lord to baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). Chrismation (Confirmation) and Holy Eucharist (First Holy Communion) are imparted at the same time immediately following baptism.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Infants – is scheduled at the Divine Liturgy on Saturdays or Sundays during the year except certain fast periods. Sponsors must be Catholics in good standing and supply a sponsor card attesting to that from their parish. While two Catholics in good standing is usual, one baptized non-Catholic can function as a Christian Witness with the Catholic sponsor. Both must be at least sixteen years of age. This is a period of spiritual formation. Please see the priest or deacon. Details are available at the parish office.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Adults – follows a period of catechumenate.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Crowning in Marriage – According to the Pastoral Policy and Guidelines for Marriage Preparation for the Catholic Church in New Jersey, couples wishing to marry must inform the pastor one year before the date of the wedding and be free to marry in the Catholic Church. They will meet with the priest and deacon in four sessions—to begin the Pre-Nuptial Questionnaire, to take FOCCUS, a communication, values, and religious inventory approved for use in the Catholic dioceses/eparchies, to complete the Pre-Nuptial Questionnaire, and for a session on the Theology of the Mystery (Sacrament). They are also required to attend Pre-Cana Conference.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance – The Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance is regularly available each Saturday 11:30 AM to 12:00 Noon. In addition, confessions are heard during the Christmas Fast (Advent) and the Great Fast (Lent) at other scheduled times. Visiting confessors are also scheduled at special times during the Great Fast. Confessions are also heard on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Great and Holy Week. Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life-endangering medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of confession at church or home where there is more privacy.

Anointing of the Sick – Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life-threatening medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of the Sacrament of Penance and Anointing of the Sick. If surgery is scheduled, please consider confession and anointing at the church or at your home rather than the hospital since there is more privacy for confession and less chance for interruption. If you are unable to come to church or are at the hospital, family members should contact the rectory so Father can anoint at the hospital.

Holy Communion and Visitation of the Sick – Holy Communion is brought to our parishioners who are ill at the hospital or at home by the deacons on Sundays and at other time by arrangement. Please contact the deacons or the rectory office by Friday prior to the Sunday communion visitation.

Funeral Services – The Office of Christian Burial is offered in ways to accommodate the needs of the family. The Epiphany Ladies Guild as part of their charity offers a Mercy Meal for families at the Parish Center following the interment. Epiphany of our Lord cemetery are two portions of Fairfax Memorial Park. Parishioners who are interested in purchasing cemetery plots should see Deacon Peter Turko.

Prayers for our Parishioners. The particular Law of the Byzantine Ruthenian Metropolitan Church directs that “the pastor is to celebrate the Divine Liturgy for the people of the parish entrusted to him on Sundays and days of precept (holydays of obligation) (canon 294). This liturgy intention for parishioners is “For the Intention of Parishioners.” The faithful who attend the Divine Liturgy for the parishioners participate, according to their state, in praying for that intention. We can continue to pray for our parishioners by several parishioners in our daily prayers each week. Decree on the Sacrament of Penance. Bishop Kurt Burnette issued a Decree, dated May 1, 2025, regarding cell phones and the Sacrament of Penance (Confession). The Bishop orders: “All cell phones, both belonging to the priest or to a penitent must be left outside the confessional or be powered off. It is not enough to have it silenced.

The Eucharistic Prayer-The Anaphora. After explaining the historical and the theological meanings of the Liturgy of the Word, St. Germanus next explains the Liturgy of the Eucharist. To accomplish this interpretation, St. Germanus treats two aspects: the work Christ accomplished on earth as re-presented in the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and then, through pulling back the curtain of heaven, revealing that what is being done here on earth is actually participating in the Liturgy going on perpetually in heaven. After bringing forth our gifts of bread and wine from the prothesis chapel and placing them on the Holy Table, the Symbol of Faith (The Creed) was professed in thanksgiving for the

works of salvation on earth enumerated in the Symbol as well as a declaration of hope to stand in heaven and contemplate the divine attributes of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit that are defined in the Creed. Then the deacon, like the Angel at the tomb, recounts the three days of the Passion and Resurrection (Let us stand aright 1st, let us stand in awe 2nd, let us be attentive 3rd day) and the people assent. The priest having called the people to raise their minds to heaven, the people assent, “We have them lifted up to the Lord.” The priest calls everyone to Eucharist, that is, Thanksgiving, and the people assent: “It is proper and just.”

Now, St. Germanus explains, the priest stands before the throne of God and speaks, one-to-One to God. He calls the people to join in the hymn Isaiah heard the Seraphim sing before the throne of God in heaven, “Holy holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts.” Meanwhile, the deacons as icons of the angels take the fans with the images of the Seraphim and wave them.

So, participating in the Divine Liturgy in heaven, the priest—standing before God the Father, declares to the Father the mysteries of our redemption: the incarnation, Divine Birth of a Virgin, the Son’s dwelling and work in this world, the cross, death, liberation of souls from Hades, resurrection, ascension and Second Coming, the priest asks God to bring about what the words of His Son say: the bread to be changed into His Body and the wine into His Blood. Further, at the hand of the priest, the Holy Spirit “testifies, completes, and changes the holy gifts into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

We, who now behold the saving work of Jesus on earth while at the same time are part of the congregation in heaven at the Heavenly Liturgy, have become the eyewitnesses of the mysteries, partakers of eternal life, and sharers of the Divine Nature, we rejoice and cry out for what we have seen and what has been done to us: “We praise You” to God the Father, “we bless You” to God the Son, and “we thank You” to God the Holy Spirit.

Then comes the remembrance of those fallen asleep in God of spirits and all flesh, “Who is the God, not of the dead but of the living”. Here, the souls of Christians fallen asleep are called to assemble with the prophets, apostles, hierarchs, and the Just, to recline at the Mystical Banquet in the Kingdom of Heaven. Thus, we are no longer simply on earth but are before the royal throne of God in heaven with the Blessed Departed.
